






### Gain experience

#### INTERVIEW WITH A NEW APPRENTICE

One of our new painting and decorating apprentices has answered a few questions to tell us a bit more about why they're doing an apprenticeship.

### What apprenticeship are you doing with Jelson?

I am doing a painting and decorating apprenticeship.

### Why did you pick an apprenticeship?

I chose to go down the apprenticeship route, because it is a great way of seeing how everything works first hand. Also, personally, I think it is a better way of learning as it is very hands-on. You can watch how certain things are done in various different ways, and then try these things for yourself and find your own way of doing them in a way that works best for you.

I also felt like an apprenticeship was a good option, because I would have a mentor/supervisor's one-on-one attention whenever I'm working. This would help me understand and learn new things, and give me the option to ask for help or advice whenever I need it.

Another reason as to why I chose an apprenticeship, is because I am earning money whilst I am learning. I feel like although this isn't one of the main reasons why I chose an apprenticeship, it can help to keep me motivated.



## Why did you pick Jelson?
